clone — An organism reproduced from the cell of a single ancestor that is genetically identical to that ancestor; **delegate** — In this case, a person sent to one of the political party conventions to participate in selecting that party's presidential candidate; **DNA** — Deoxyribonucleic acid, a material containing genetic information that is found in all living organisms; **embryo** — An organism in the early stages of development, before birth; **flyby** — A term used by NASA to describe the flight of a spacecraft near to a planet or other object in space in order to study that object; **nominate** — To formally choose a candidate for election; **republic** — A state in which citizens elect representatives to manage the government; **rotunda** — A round building or room with an overhead dome; **spice trade** — A commercial activity dating back to ancient times involving the sale and shipping of spices from Asia to various other parts of the world.
