recession — A period of temporary economic decline lasting at least six months; **rebate** — A partial refund to someone for the amount they paid for something; **stock market** — A market in which stocks are bought and sold, or the overall level of prices in these markets; **interest rate** — The rate of money paid regularly for the use of money borrowed from a bank or other large money lender; **treaty** — A formal agreement between countries or groups; **ghost dance** — An American Indian religious cult during the 1800s, based on the performance of a ritual dance believed to drive away white people; **suffrage** — The right to vote in political elections; **amendment** — In this case, an article added to the U.S. Constitution; **portrait** — A painting, drawing, or photograph of a person, especially one showing only the head and shoulders.
