### News Names

**Archduke Franz Ferdinand** — The heir to the Austro-Hungarian throne from 1896 until his death in 1914; **Frank Buckles** — The only surviving U.S. veteran of World War One; **Moko** — A dolphin in New Zealand who recently saved two stranded whales; **President Woodrow Wilson** — The 28th president of the United States; **Rachel Corrie** — American activist who was killed in the Gaza Strip in 2003; **Triangle Shirtwaist Factory** — A factory owned by the Triangle Shirtwaist Company in New York City that was destroyed by fire in 1911.

**activist** — Someone who devotes a great deal of time and energy to a particular cause; **bottlenose dolphin** — A type of dolphin with a stout body and short beak; **compensation** — Something, usually money, awarded to someone as repayment for a loss, injury, or suffering; **disinterested** — Not influenced by considerations of personal advantage; **Hercules beetle** — A large tropical American beetle; **optimism** — Hopefulness and confidence about the future; **trench warfare** — A type of combat in which opposing troops fight from trenches facing each other; **union** — In this case, an organized group or workers formed to protect their rights; **veteran** — A person who has served in the military.
