BASIC/GENERAL

A) I am the prime minister of the United Kingdom, or U.K.

B) I grew up close to Oxford, England, and then attended the famous Oxford University. I was elected to Parliament in 1997 as a member of the Conservative Party. In 2016, U.K. citizens voted to leave the European Union. After this so-called “Brexit” vote, Prime Minister David Cameron resigned. Even though I didn’t want the Brexit vote to happen, the Conservative Party voted me in to take care of the details.

C) My government has just released its plan for how the “Brexit” will work. People from every political party — including my own — have criticized aspects of this plan. Before the plan can go into effect, the British Parliament must approve it. That vote is scheduled for December 11th. **Who am I?** (*Theresa May.*)

ADVANCED

A) I am the prime minister of the United Kingdom.

B) After graduating from Oxford University, I worked in banking and finance for 20 years. In 1997, I won election to Parliament as a member of the Conservative Party, and served as the Home Secretary of the U.K. for six years. When David Cameron resigned in 2016, following the “Brexit” vote that called for the U.K. to leave the European Union, I won my party’s vote to replace him as prime minister.

C) My major responsibility as PM has been to deal with implementing the Brexit. I recently negotiated a plan approved by all the members of the EU. But this plan, which now has to be approved by the British Parliament, received a lot of criticism from members of my own party, as well as the Labour Party. The plan, which calls for the U.K. to pay the EU about \$50 billion, goes up for vote in Parliament on December 11th. **Who am I?** (*Theresa May.*)
